OVERVIEW

If art and history is your thing then Kendal is a great place to visit. Set your satnav to follow the route via Bowland Bridge to avoid the crowds then ready yourself for a cultural assault on the senses.

MORNING

What is now south Cumbria was at the epicentre of the Quaker movement and there are many local landmarks to visit (In Kendal you'll find the Quaker Tapestry that depicts local life over the centuries using a series of unique tapestries.



You can enjoy lunch at the excellent café at the Quaker Tapestry or seek out one of Kendal's many independent tea shops, such as Brew Brothers or Comida in the town.

AFTERNOON

After lunch pay a visit to Kendal Museum to learn more about local history and spot some very special display signs. Alfred Wainwright was Honorary Curator at the museum for many years so as well as viewing an excellent array of local artefacts – including the remains of a Viking dugout boat – you can also spot exhibit labels handwritten by Wainwright himself.



Round the day off with a visit to Abbot Hall Art Gallery which has a wide range of interesting artwork covering local artists of note, as well as works by nationally renowned artists.

LOCAL TIP

While you're in Kendal take a detour to the castle for excellent views over the town and some great local history.
