OVERVIEW

When visiting somewhere new there's nothing quite like escaping the crowds and finding the quieter spots that are popular with the locals, and these gems fit that bill perfectly.

MORNING

Begin with a visit to Barkbooth Lot, one of Cumbria Wildlife Trust's quietest and most tucked away nature reserve. During April/May it comes alive with thousands of bluebells and on long hot summer days the woodland walk is the perfect place to find cooling shade alongside the beck.



AFTERNOON

When it's time for lunch the Hare and Hounds at Bowland Bridge will fit the bill perfectly with its unique take on the classic pub menu all created with locally sourced ingredients.



Finish the afternoon with a short drive up to nearby Scout Scar where one very short stroll uphill will bring you to a long ridge with far reaching views of the local area. Up here there are some excellent outcrops of limestone pavement as well as lots of juniper bushes to put you in the mood for a G&T in the evening.
