The Victorians used to take a boat over Morecambe Bay from Fleetwood, then hop on a steam train to the southern tip of Windermere, before boarding a steamer and enjoying a cruise all the way up to Ambleside. While boats no longer cross the bay you can still recreate most of that journey.
